

NOTIFY the PHYSICIAN'S NURSE

- 1. If you think that your bowel prep did not completely clear the intestines for any reason, please call your doctor or the doctor on call for an alternative prep..
- 2. If you have a history of artificial heart valve, recent joint replacements or have been hospitalized for bacterial endocarditis, **please call your physician's nurse** so that antibiotic coverage can be arranged prior to your procedure.
- 3. If you are on any type of prescribed medications, <u>please notify the prescribing doctor</u> of your upcoming colonoscopy/surgery. Please make sure that doctor agrees that it is okay to stop the medication. These types of drugs should be stopped 3-7 days prior to your procedure (if recommended by your prescribing physician).

If you take a fluid pill or water pill (plain diuretic) do not take these on the day of the procedure. These include clorothiazide, hydrochorothiazide, furosemide, bumetanide, toresmide, amiloride, spironoactone, triameterene, mannitol, dyazide, maxzide and moduretic.
